Meet Patricia.

Patricia is a farmer in southern Zambia. Like most farmers here, she used to grow maize, a crop that requires a great deal of water to grow. Patricia, like so many Zambians living in the drought-prone region, was therefore left vulnerable to the elements each year - the rainfall determining whether she would be able to grow enough maize to feed her family.

EWB volunteers worked with Patricia and other local farmers, helping them adopt sorghum as a crop alternative. And the results were astounding: Sorghum, which requires very little rainfall, has flourished throughout the region.

Now Patricia stands before her field proudly, which only one year earlier lay bare and dry. She is now working with other farmers, helping them grow sorghum as well, creating opportunities for her community to improve its future.

It is the hard work, passion and commitment of people like Patricia that inspires our work in developing communities. She is one of the millions of people around the world living in poverty, not because she is lazy or weak, but because she lacks opportunities to improve her life.
