This Fellowship opportunity is with Detiina and is based in Accra & Paga, Ghana.

About Detiina

As a woman from an underprivileged background in a rural community, Nafisa Adams was able to fund her university education through making and selling beaded jewellery. Nafisa took part in EWB's Kumvana Fellowship Program in 2015 and has since decided to devote her life to economically empowering other rural women through making and selling handicraft products. She now employs dozens of women in Northern Ghana.

Detiina means "Our Hope" in Kasem, a language spoken by the people of Paga, located in the Upper East Region of Ghana. Detiina's mission is to create opportunities for women living in rural and impoverished communities, in Ghana, to earn an alternative source of income by learning, developing and applying local skills in a sustainable way. Detiina aspires to help reduce poverty among women, especially those living in rural villages in the Upper East Region of Ghana, by providing each woman with the proper resources to strive towards a better life. About the role

In 2011, Nafisa launched her NGO, Beads of Hope, to train women in her rural home to make beaded

jewellery. In 2016, she launched Detiina as a sustainable business arm of the operations, with a focus on bringing Beads of Hope's products to the international market.

In 2016 Detiina focused on laying foundational work and now needs a self-starting marketing, sales and promotions professional to steer us to success. While mainly based out of the EWB office in Accra, this position will also require travel to Paga, in rural Northern Ghana, where Detiina's main operations reside.

As a Marketing, Sales and Promotions Coordinator for Detiina, your responsibilities will include:

- Finding new markets for Detiina products, connecting us with retail and wholesale opportunities in Ghana and abroad
- Creation of marketing material for Detiina, including press releases, social media content and other promotional material
- Running sales events in Ghana and assisting to create an engaging local sales strategy
- Creation of a social media strategy, and the ongoing management of our social media platforms

- Experience working with ecommerce platforms

- Friendly, outgoing, people-oriented person

- Willing to bring a SLR camera for content creation purposes (EWB provides fellows a \$300 technology budget for work-related technology requirements such as SLR camera for Detiina's content creation).

Compensation

All costs relating to the placement are either paid for directly by EWB (airfare, insurance, vaccinations, trainings) or indirectly through a living stipend, which covers food, living expenses, local travel, etc. Fellows also receive an honorarium to assist with repatriation costs. The stipend covers basic living expenses for a modest lifestyle in your placement country. You should not expect to save money during this year or use the stipend to cover previous expenses (e.g. student loans).

Additionally, EWB offers a range of benefits including insurance, a settlement allowance, professional development opportunities, and more.
