The EWB Fellows Program exists to develop a cadre of Systems Change Leaders by equipping them with the opportunities, competencies and skills needed to build a more thriving and sustainable world. Every year we recruit 25-30 outstanding people for the 12-month Fellowship, placing successful candidates in one of our early-stage Ventures located throughout sub-Saharan Africa. This Fellowship opportunity is with Mango Fund and is based in Uganda.

About Mango Fund

Mango Fund is an impact investment fund that seeks to maximize in-country returns for the fund and provide positive social impact for the people of Uganda. Mango Fund was founded in May 2011 and believes that the success of emerging, growth-oriented businesses that seek investment at the level described as the “missing middle” is crucial to the economic development of East Africa.

Mango Fund is focused on businesses that leverage technology to perform value addition activities within their base countries. Our hypothesis is twofold: 1) local value addition keeps capital within local economies, and 2) the development of more advanced technical capabilities facilitates entry to more robust global markets.

About the role

The investment analyst position offers qualified individuals the rare opportunity to shape and maximize the impact potential of the fund. The analyst will actively participate in the following activities as Mango

Fund serves its markets:

- Analyze historical and projected financial statements for prospective clients so as to determine the viability of the client businesses
- Prepare and present investment communication materials for the Investment Committee
- Conduct industry and market research and assist in Mango Fund's business development efforts
- Prepare and review financial statements for portfolio companies and prepare reports on company and portfolio performance
- Establish and maintain quality client relationships to ensure responsive client service and to enhance new business opportunities
- As a relatively new organization, Mango Fund expects the analyst to be comfortable wearing many hats

EWB and Mango Fund work towards similar goals of empowering African entrepreneurs to catalyze change through innovation. Both EWB and Mango Fund provide seed funding for SME's.

EWB is interested in supporting Mango Fund with our fellows to create impact and increase technical capacity. Simultaneously EWB is interested in learning about Mango Fund's operational effectiveness and potential areas of growth in the impact investing space for EWB. This role is therefore considered a learning partnership.

Skills & Qualifications

Investment analyst must demonstrate a commitment for international development. In addition to the minimum requirements, we are seeking exceptional professionals who share the following skills and characteristics:

- Bachelor's or equivalent degree with specialization in finance, accounting or economics;
- Experience in a financial institution (2+ years) with a proven track record
- Strong analytical and problem solving skills and sound business judgment to identify issues and present creative and practical solutions
- Excellent communication skills
- Strong numerical ability and quantitative skills
- Ability to work successfully in multicultural teams
- Demonstrated teamwork skills
- Strong client service orientation with openness to feedback and new ideas
- Experience of having worked on investments related to the manufacturing, agribusiness and services sectors will be an added advantage
- Fluency in English desire to acquire local Ugandan language is essential (candidates fluent in local Ugandan language will be considered highly competitive)

Please note: You must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or landed immigrant in order to apply. No exceptions.

Compensation

All costs relating to the placement are either paid for directly by EWB (airfare, insurance, vaccinations, trainings) or indirectly through a living stipend, which covers food, living expenses, local travel, etc. Fellows also receive an honorarium to assist with repatriation costs. The stipend covers basic living expenses for a modest lifestyle in your placement country. You should not expect to save money during this year or use the stipend to cover previous expenses (e.g. student loans).

Additionally, EWB offers a range of benefits including insurance, a settlement allowance, professional development opportunities, and more.
