The EWB Fellows Program exists to develop a cadre of Systems Change Leaders by equipping them with the opportunities, competencies and skills needed to build a more thriving and sustainable world. Every year we recruit 25-30 outstanding people for the 12-month Fellowship, placing successful candidates in one of our early-stage Ventures located throughout sub-Saharan Africa. This Fellowship opportunity is with Mango Fund and is based in Uganda.

About Mango Fund

Mango Fund is an impact investment fund that seeks to maximize in-country returns for the fund and provide positive social impact for the people of Uganda. Mango Fund was founded in May 2011 and believes that the success of emerging, growth-oriented businesses that seek investment at the level described as the “missing middle” is crucial to the economic development of East Africa.

Mango Fund is focused on businesses that leverage technology to perform value addition activities within their base countries. Our hypothesis is twofold: 1) local value addition keeps capital within local economies, and 2) the development of more advanced technical capabilities facilitates entry to more robust global markets.

About the role

The M&E Specialist opportunity offers qualified individuals the rare opportunity to shape and maximize the impact potential of the fund by designing and implementing the framework that will be used by

Mango Fund to assess and communicate its impact. The M&E Specialist will actively participate in the following activities as Mango Fund serves its markets:

- Work with Mango Fund management and board of directors to design and implement a high quality M&E framework that suits the needs of our stakeholders. The output of this framework should enable Mango Fund to tell its “impact” story.
- Collect and analyze M&E data in the field to help Mango Fund assess its impact
- Gather feedback from clients on areas of service delivery, loan impact, business practices, etc., to enable Mango Fund to always improve its practices
- Play an active role in drafting reports and grant proposals to various Mango Fund stakeholder
- Play a key role on the communication side of things by drafting press releases and managing the website and social media

EWB and Mango Fund work towards similar goals of empowering African entrepreneurs to catalyze change through innovation. Both EWB and Mango Fund provide seed funding for SMEs.

EWB is interested in supporting Mango Fund with our fellows to create impact and increase technical capacity. Simultaneously, EWB is interested in learning about Mango Fund’s operational effectiveness and potential areas of growth in the impact investing space for EWB. This role is therefore considered a learning partnership.

Skills & Qualifications

The M&E specialist must demonstrate a commitment to international development. In addition to the minimum requirements, we are seeking exceptional professionals who share the following skills and characteristics:

- Bachelor’s or equivalent degree with relevant specializations for the role
- Experience in the impact evaluation space with a proven track record
- Strong analytical and problem solving skills and sound business judgment to identify issues and present creative and practical solutions
- Excellent communication skills
- Ability to work successfully in multicultural teams
- Demonstrated teamwork skills
- Strong client service orientation with openness to feedback and new ideas
- Openness to travel extensively across Uganda
- Previous experience in Africa or other emerging economies will be regarded positively

Please note: You must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or landed immigrant in order to apply. No exceptions.

Compensation

All costs relating to the placement are either paid for directly by EWB (airfare, insurance, vaccinations, trainings) or indirectly through a living stipend, which covers food, living expenses, local travel, etc. Fellows also receive an honorarium to assist with repatriation costs. The stipend covers basic living expenses for a modest lifestyle in your placement country. You should not expect to save money during this year or use the stipend to cover previous expenses (ex. student loans).

Additionally, EWB offers a range of benefits including insurance, a settlement allowance, professional development opportunities, and more.
